Missions Emphasis for March is McLeod Emergency Food Shelf



McLEOD FOOD SHELF The Mission emphasis for March is the McLeod Emergency Food Shelf. This year, the McLeod Emergency Food

Shelf is celebrating 36 years of service in McLeod County. The Minnesota Food Share March Campaign brings together various Minnesota organizations, businesses, and places of worship to help keep 300 food shelves stocked statewide throughout the year. This March drive is very important to our local food shelf since monies and poundage of food collected reflect the matching fund from Minnesota Foodshare, corporate, foundation business and individual dollars secured into the Food Fund. The amount of dollars distributed to our local food shelf from the Food Fund directly correlates to total collected right here in McLeod County.

In 2020, the McLeod Emergency Food Shelf served 4,193 individuals. Of this total, 33 percent of these individuals were under the age of 18, and nine percent of the individuals were over the age of 65. They distributed 492,668 pounds of food. This is down 12 percent from 2019. Executive Director Lennie Albers explained that many other agencies were filling the gap of providing food and money to the people living in McLeod County.

In addition to traditional on-site distributions in Glencoe and Hutchison, MEFS was able to fasttract through the coordination and launch of the Mobile Outreach Program – Driving Away Hunger. Driving Away Hunger has provided just over 16 percent of MEFS's service since its first route in August. They are excited to see where this path leads! Driving Away Hunger Mobile Outreach Program distributed 15,088 lbs. at eight locations in six cities impacting an average of 86 households each month. Forty-five percent of those served were age 65 or older.



You can bring your non-perishable food items to church and drop them off in the grocery cart in the narthex. Cash donations are especially helpful since the buying power of McLeod Emergency Food shelf is much greater and your cash goes much further. Suggested items requested by the food shelf are canned fruit juices, hot and dry cereal, dry, powdered, or canned milk, hearty soups or stew, canned beef, tuna or chicken, peanut butter, canned fruits, or vegetables, canned or boxed main dishes, pasta, rice and pasta sauce, baked beans, canned chili, potato buds, crackers, sugar, flour, coffee, tea, hot cocoa, pancake or biscuit mix. Special treats like cake, packaged cookies, muffin mix, granola bars, pudding or Jell-o mix are also appreciated. Personal care items for babies, children and adults are also welcome since the Food Shelf can only buy food items.
