✤First Reading: Numbers 21:4-9

⁴From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. ⁵The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." ⁶Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. ⁷The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." ⁹So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:1-10

¹You were dead through the trespasses and sins ²in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. ³All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else.

⁴But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us ⁵even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— ⁶and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. ⁸For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— ⁹not the result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

March Mission Focus: McLeod Emergency Food Shelf, Cooking and Baking Items

Each March, the McLeod Emergency Food Shelf (MEFS) participates in the Minnesota Food Share March Campaign. Every dollar and pound collected gets multiplied by the Food Fund. The MEFS saw a nearly 20%

increase in 2023 over the previous year, a record high in its 40-year history. 714,907 pounds of food were distributed to 5,791 individuals and 2,152 households across the county.

The majority of the financial support for MEFS is received from directly from the generous individuals, businesses, organizations, churches (including Christ Lutheran) and schools in and around McLeod County.

This month, we will also focus on cooking and baking items such as flour, sugar, oils, spices, cream soups, etc. These items often don't fit into the food shelf's budget.

We collected donated 105 pounds of pancake mix, syrup and other items in February. Thank you, Christ Lutheran, for your continued generosity!!!

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping.

ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*

ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging.

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging.

*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope, no plastic bags or wrap

When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide much-needed self-care, critical germ fighting supplies and the chance for our neighbors in need to regain dignity amidst fear and uncertainty.
